BONE BUILDERS senior strength training and health education program is now being offered at:

Martin Andersen Senior Center, Rockledge Monday/Wednesday at 9:00 AM

Palm Bay Community Center, Palm Bay Monday/Wednesday at 9:30 AM

During one-hour classes that meet twice weekly, participants lift light weights to improve their bone and muscle strength while also working to better their balance.

Bone Builders class are limited in size and registration is required in advance. Currently, a waiting list exists for Martin Andersen Senior Center; however, spots are still available at Palm Bay Community Center.
